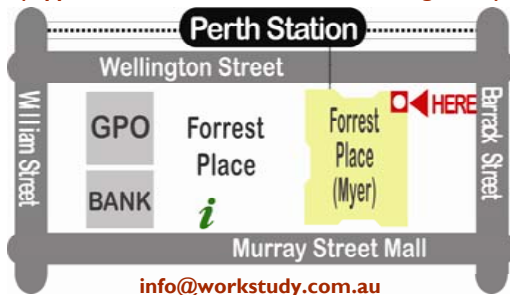

Since 2003, many groups of Japanese children have attended Perth primary and pre-schools, under a program coordinated by Work Study.

The program builds International Children who are able to live in a global environment by giving Japanese children, and their parents, a taste of Australian culture and language.

In addition, there is the benefit of both native Japanese and English speakers interacting in the classroom. Carlisle school principal Lea Hadley said "It also gives our children a direct link with the Japanese culture" and added that all children

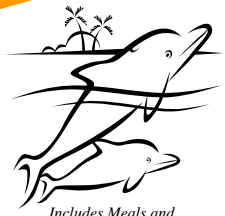
